LECTURE HOURS AND ACADEMIC CREDITS

Participants from partner universities with "Agreements for Student Exchange" will receive credit for their course work at Ritsumeikan in accordance with the policies of their home institutions. Most classes at Ritsumeikan University are 90 minutes in duration. Each semester is 15 weeks long, followed by a two-week examination period. Students are required to take a minimum of 10 hours of classes per week (minimum of 7 class sessions per week). Students are advised to confirm the requirements of their home institutions in advance regarding the transfer of academic credits.
