Yoichiro Tateiwa started his journalist career as a reporter at NHK after receiving a B.A. degree from Hitotsubashi University. He uncovered how the Status Forces Agreement of the US Forces had been damaging the people of Okinawa as a reporter at Okinawa bureau. While being the head of Tehran bureau, he revealed an untold struggle among Iranian regime. After his arrest and sending back to Japan as a persona non grata, he focused on investigating Japanese government and politics and revealed government systematic schemes of using budget in favor of interest groups. He also uncovered chemical substances causing cancer to more than 100 workers across Japan. He left NHK after leading the team of the Panama Papers. He is an author of six books including an award-winning *"This Is Fact Checking."* Mr. Tateiwa was a visiting journalist at American University from 2010 to 2011 and 2016 to 2017.
