Consideration on Absent from Classes over COVID 19 Outbreak

The spring semester classes will be held on the web. Let us explain how to take a class!

There are roughly two methods of taking classes. Note that the method varies depending on the course you take!

On-Demand Classes using manaba+R "Non-live-stream classes"

(Features)

- Students work on the assignments or instructions received from the instructor within the designated time period
- Students work on homework and assignments on their own schedule
- Course materials such as online videos and assignments for students to work on are provided through manaba+R Download course materials prior to

2 Live-Stream Classes classes distributed on real time as scheduled **(Features)**

- Instructor and students learn together in the same online learning environment.
- · Live-stream classes are conducted on the designated day of the week and class period according to the time schedule.
- Classes are conducted same as traditional face-to-face classes.
- Mainly use online conference system (skype/zoom, etc.)

Prohibition of Behavior against information ethics

To all students,

April 28, 2020

The web-based classes using manaba+R, etc. will be resumed from Thursday, May 7. In order to resume the web-based classes, the university strictly prohibits the following behaviors which lead to invasion of privacy, copyright infringement or obstructing classes because these behaviors violate the Ritsumeikan University Student Disciplinary Regulations (Article 5-3 Behavior against information ethics). As those can be subject to disciplinary actions, please be careful with this.

1. Sharing the URLs and ID/Password for meetings which were distributed in the live-stream classes using the online conference system such as Zoom, Skype, etc. with third parties unrelated to the classes.

2. Taking photos of the aspect of the live-stream classes without permission of the instructor in charge or attendees, then sharing and spreading them on SNS, etc. Also, recording the contents of classes and publishing them without permission of the instructor in charge.

3. Redistributing course materials which were distributed in web-based classes without permission of the instructor in charge.

4. Sharing the URLs regarding the unlisted video materials published on the internet (youtube, etc.) for class use only, with the third parties unrelated to the classes.

Resumption of classes online from May 7 (1st Bulletin)

As we informed you on April 7 through manaba+R and other platforms, Ritsumeikan University has canceled all classes from April 8 until May 6. The university will resume classes online from May 7 and will in principle continue to hold classes online throughout the spring semester. Details of the resumed classes will be communicated to you shortly, so please continue to check for messages from the university. At the present moment, the planned schedule is as follows:

O Given the cancellation of classes until the end of April, some classes will follow a changed syllabus (changes to course plans, grade evaluation method, etc.). Individual students are requested to check the syllabus on or after April 30. Syllabus for some courses will be revised by May 6, so please be sure to check for updates.

* On April 30, students may experience a delay in connecting to the website due to system maintenance on that date.

OThe four-day period from May 19 to May 22 is designated as the period for altering course registrations (open to all students).

For the spring semester of this academic year, as well as cancelling course registrations, students will also be able to register for additional courses. Students who omitted to register or who for some other reason were unable to register in the period from April 6 to April 8 will also be able to register during the abovementioned four-day period.

OThe application period for manaba+R Early Use Request is from April 30 to May 22. Students considering altering their course registration should make an Early-Use Request on the course for which they intend to register after altering their original registration. Such students are reminded to carry out the official cancelation or additional registration procedures between May 19 and May 22. To all our students

Resumption of classes from May 7 (2nd Bulletin)

Preparation for participation in online classes

As we informed you recently through the university website, Ritsumeikan University will resume classes online from May 7, even if the state of emergency is extended beyond that date. Following the resumption, online classes will continue in principle until the end of the spring semester. It is highly unfortunate that the current coronavirus (COVID-19) infection has led to an ongoing situation where face-to-face teaching cannot take place, but despite having to switch to online media, the university is committed to the utmost efforts to maintain the quality of teaching so that all students are in a position to reach the learning goals set for their respective courses.

To prepare for participation in online classes, students are requested to read the guidance below and ensure that they have the necessary arrangements in place.

1. Requirements for participation in classes

(1) Terminal device

Please make sure you have a device that connects to the Internet (personal computer, smartphone, or tablet). For information on how to install and use frequently used software packages such as Microsoft Office, please visit the homepage of our IT Support Center: <u>http://www.ritsumei.ac.jp/rainbow/service-search-cate-software/#catetop</u>

To make sure that you can use manaba+R, please check the list of compatible browsers here.

(2) Internet connection

3. Support with arrangements for participating in online classes

Given the present circumstances, we have been obliged to ask students to make arrangements to participate in online classes at very short notice. Moreover, even if the state of emergency is lifted on May 7, it may continue to be necessary to prohibit or restrict access to the campus, in which case it will still not be possible to use the university's telecommunications, printing and other facilities. In view of this situation, the university continues to investigate ways of supporting students (undergraduate and graduate students) to put in place the optimal environment for participating in online classes at home. We plan to contact students with specific details of these support arrangements by the end of April. To all students,

Resumption of Classes from May 7 (3rd report) - Preparation for Online Classes -

1. Support for preparing an environment suitable for online classes

Ritsumeikan University has decided to provide all undergraduate and graduate students with the sum of 30,000 yen in an effort to support students in preparing an environment suitable for online classes. This is in addition to the free rental computers and communication devices that we introduced in the 2nd report and is part of an emergency aid package totaling 2.5 billion yen that the Ritsumeikan Academy provides to students of Ritsumeikan University, Ritsumeikan Asia Pacific University, and affiliated high schools, junior high schools, and elementary schools in response to a succession of situations, including limitations to learning opportunities, changes in teaching methods, and difficulties in studying and lifestyle, caused by the spread of novel coronavirus (COVID-19). 2. Request for cooperation to reduce access congestion

In order to prevent a recurrence of the serious manaba+R operation delays that occurred at Ritsumeikan University on April 6 and 7, the universities are increasing the number of and improving the servers and asking teachers formulate ways to reduce access congestion while teaching online.

Students are also asked to cooperate in reducing access congestion by adhering to the following. To check the manaba+R manual click <u>here</u>.

- After May 4, lesson plans (for May 7 15) will be announced in the course news and materials.
 From then on, <u>the content of the next week's class will be announced in the course</u> <u>news and materials in advance</u>, so please be sure to check them. Make sure that you download the stipulated class materials and assignments and work on them in accordance with the instructions.
- ② Congestion to manaba+R is worst at the beginning of regular classes (9:00, 10:40, etc.), so <u>please</u> avoid the times immediately before and after classes and <u>download class materials</u> as early as possible.
- ③ Please check and take a note of the URL and password for live classes in advance so that you can participate without accessing manaba+R. If materials used in the class are made available beforehand, we recommend that you download them well in advance.
- ④ Set manaba+R reminders to receive notifications of updates for each class and more.

3. Compliance with Information Ethics

The following actions violate information ethics and so are strictly prohibited when attending online classes.

- Sharing with third parties unrelated to the class, URLs, meeting IDs, and passwords provided for live classes which use online conference systems such as Zoom and Skype.
- ② Taking photos of live classes without the permission of the instructor in charge or attendees, and sharing or disseminating said photo(s) on social media and online platforms. In addition, the contents of the class may not be recorded or made public without the permission of the instructor in charge of the class.
- ③ Redistribution of materials distributed in online classes without the permission of the instructor in charge of the class.
- (4) Sharing with third parties unrelated to the class, the URLs for video materials used in class that are limited for teaching purposes on the internet (YouTube, etc.).

In addition to violating privacy, copyright, and obstructing classes, these actions may have serious social consequences. We call on all students to be strongly aware of the importance of adhering to information ethics.

	How will classes be conducted from May 7?	Web-based classes will be conducted until the end of the spring semester in principle.	
Course taking	What are web-based classes?	Web-based classes refer to classes delivered remotely by using a variety of ICTs. These include classes using manaba+R that enables students to get course materials, submit assignments, and receive feedback online; similar classes using email, cloud, and other services; two-way live streaming classes using videoconferencing services such as Skype and Zoom; and on-demand classes providing lecture videos. For details, please check the syllabus of each course. If details are not available in the syllabus, contact the administrative office of a college offering the course.	
	What features can I use when accessing manaba+R on my smartphone?	You can use almost the same features of manaba+R on your smartphone as on your PC. You can submit assignments too on your smartphone when browser-based submission is selected for them. - 1. If you are infected with the COVID 19

It does not constitute as official absence, and the student will be able to receive academic guidance and support concerning classes if he or she applies for the consideration.
