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## 1. Eligibility

All GLA students, including near-native speakers of Japanese, are eligible to take Japanese courses from Spring 2023 onwards.



### 2. Course Lineup / Japanese Course Registration

- Details of procedures vary depending on the placement level.
- Information about the course registration schedule and course details are available on the actual semester timetable on the GLA website.
- Students must check their placement level. It will be sent to their university email by the start of regular course registration.
  - \*(for Spring 2023 new students) It will be sent to their personal email once your university email is issued on March 30.
- A full course list is available on the next page.
- "Auto" in the "Registration" line means auto-registration by the GLA Office. "Self" means students are responsible for dropping for the course.

### 2. Course Lineup / Japanese Course Registration

### [Course Sequence]

- In principle, students must pass the initially-placed course to move on one level higher. If they fail, they must retake the same level of the course.
- Students will not be permitted to register for lower-level courses after successful completion of higher-level courses in the sequence.

### [Course Drop]

- Students can drop Japanese language courses by themselves regardless of the course level.
- Course drop procedures and schedules are the same as other non-Japanese courses. Refer to the <a href="Course Registration Guidebook(P.29)">Course Registration Guidebook(P.29)</a> for more details.
  - \*(for Spring 2023 new students)
    The detail of how to do course registration/drop and to use system(GLARS) will be explained at the new-student orientation on March 30, 2023.
- If you drop a Japanese Language Course but want to reinstate it, you must submit the <u>course registration form</u> to the <u>Academic Advising Center</u> within the appropriate registration periods. Therefore, consider dropping carefully.

### 3. Placement

- Please check your placement type by the flowchart on the next page.
- Students must complete the required placement procedures described in the following pages, based on their placement type A - D.
- All dates and times are displayed in JST.
- Missing due dates will result in students not being permitted to register for a Japanese language course in Spring 2023. Such students may opt to take one in Fall 2023.
- Students who meet the eligibility may apply for non-credit bearing courses during the set application period. For details, please refer to <u>4. Miscellaneous: Non-Credit Japanese Courses</u>.
- Students are recommended to start studying Japanese in advance for a seamless transition.



- 2. Take ROJPT (Ritsumeikan Online Japanese Placement Test)
  - Login ID: Student ID Number for current students, Application Number for Spring 2023 new students
  - Password: Date of Birth (yyyymmdd)

Due Date(#1&#2): March 8, (Wed), 9:00 AM

- 3. Attend an interview with a JPNS Program coordinator (only after completing #1 & #2) Interview Periods: Tuesday, March 14, 9:00-17:20 Thursday, March 16, 9:00-17:20
  - To book an interview, you need to access <a href="HERE">HERE</a> and fill out your student ID number (in case of new student; application number) in the field for your preferred date and time by **Thursday, March 16, 16:50**<a href="PM">PM</a>.
  - Up to this deadline, you can change your interview reservation at any time. \*However, the appointment must be confirmed at least 30 minutes before the start of the own interview.
  - Students who fail to attend the interview without prior notice will NOT be allowed to take Japanese language courses in Spring 2023.
  - If you are unable to attend both days, please consult with the GLA Office by Monday, March 13, 9:00AM.

Placement Level will be determined by the Japanese Program Coordinator based on their Japanese studies status, ROJPT, and interview.

- Students who fail to attend the interview without prior notice will NOT be allowed to take Japanese language courses in Spring 2023.
- If you are unable to attend both days, please consult with the GLA by Monday, March 13, 9:00AM.
- \*\* Students may register for JPNS 2001 by retaking ROJPT and Japanese Interview. Unless otherwise, students will be registered for JPNS 1003. Students who want to retake ROJPT and interview to register for JPNS 2001 must contact the GLA Office by March 1 (Wed) 9:00 AM.

### 3. Placement – Type D

Students in Type D have taken the non-credit bearing courses, "Advanced Japanese" or "Higher Advanced Japanese," by Fall 2022. (Applicable only to students admitted in 2019-2022)

#### **Required Procedures**

- 1. Take ROJPT (Ritsumeikan Online Japanese Placement Test)
  - Login ID: Student ID Number for current students
  - Password: Date of Birth (yyyymmdd)
  - Students who previously earned an "F" in Advanced Japanese do not have to take ROJPT and attend an interview(#3). You need to submit #2 only. JPNS 3001 will be auto-registered for the students.
  - Students who have passed the JLPT N1 and complete the Higher Advanced Japanese, do not need to take the ROJPT. Such students must submit the N1 certificate to the GLA Office by March 1(Wed), 9:00 AM.

### 3. Placement – "No assessment necessary"

The following students will be **REQUIRED** to retake ROJPT in Fall 2023.

- Students who have completed Japanese Language I-IV by Fall 2022, and; Students who will not take a Japanese language course in Spring 2023, but; Students who plan to take a Japanese language course in Fall 2023.
- Students who will be placed in type B or C in Fall 2023.

ROJPT information about students will be provided before starting Fall 2023.

- •Students are responsible for confirming that the non-credit-bearing courses do not time-conflict with other courses.
- •Students can take these courses at the same time as Regular Credit-Bearing Courses.
