This journal is the flagship of our Institute's publications and has been esteemed by our contributors and readers as such since its inception six years ago. In our postdoctoral schemes, we encourage postdoctoral researchers to situate their unique findings in broader social contexts so that specialists in other fields and non-specialists can appreciate the value of their scientific endeavors. This policy is also implicitly indicated in our Journal's disciplinary and interdisciplinary orientations.

As we congratulate and bid farewell to our present generation of researchers, we also feel a sense of pride, as this reconfirms that our orientations and policies for fostering next-generation researchers are on the right track.

We hope that this volume embodies our aspirations to balance scientific depth and social width as

well as disciplinary rigidity and flexible scientific communication. We are very grateful to all those who contributed to our activities and to bringing out this volume by reviewing, advising, and encouraging us. Your sincere commitment and kind support make all of our endeavors possible.

As always, we depend on your continued support and encouragement for the coming volume. We especially appreciate the submission of your papers as research articles. As for the book review section, we are proud of our policy of publishing book reviews that introduce research works and primary sources in Asian and Japanese languages in fields related to Asia-Japan Research, since the vast majority of materials in these languages are not currently available in English. We will fervently welcome your submission of book reviews for this purpose.

In conclusion, we would like to express to all researchers, to senior members of our scientific communities and to next-generation researchers, that we are sincerely looking forward to receiving your prospective contributions.
