Kuik Cheng-Chwee is Professor of International Relations at the Institute of Malaysian and International Studies (IKMAS), National University of Malaysia (UKM). He is concurrently a nonresident senior fellow at the Foreign Policy Institute, School of Advanced International Studies, Johns Hopkins University. Professor Kuik's research focuses on the external policies of small and secondary states, big powers in the Indo-Pacific, Asian security, and international relations.



He is author of *Theorizing Hedging: Explaining Shifts and Variations in Alignment Choices* (Cambridge, forthcoming), co-author (with David Lampton and Selina Ho) of *Rivers of Iron: Railroads and Chinese Power in Southeast Asia* (2020) and co-editor (with Alice Ba and Sueo Sudo) of *Institutionalizing East Asia* (2016). He has been listed in Stanford University's Top 2% Scientists, subfield International Relations, since 2023.
