A flu vaccine is the best way to reduce the chances that you catch seasonal flu and spread it to others. We have set up an opportunity with the cooperation of hospitals near the campus. Please take advantage of this opportunity to receive flu vaccine. You may receive vaccine on any campus. As Parents Association of Student Education will support part of the cost for students, students can receive flu vaccine at 2,000 yen. Ritsumeikan University will determine whether it can take place on campus based on the business continuity plan (BCP) levels established by the Ritsumeikan Trust Crisis Response Task Force. The on-campus medical examination can take place if the BCP level is 2 or below.

- ★★If you have had serious side effects in the past, you cannot take vaccination on campus.
- (1) Please wear a mask and use hand alcohol disinfection. Please cooperate with us as the temperature will be measured at the reception.
- (2) If you meet the following conditions, you will not be able to receive a vaccination.
 - 1. Do you have symptoms such as fever, cough, shortness of breath, general fatigue, sore throat, runny nose or nasal congestion, headache, joint / muscle pain, diarrhea, nausea or vomiting (so-called cold symptoms)?
 - 2. Do you take antipyretics (fever medications)?
 - $3.\ \mbox{Do}$ you feel any abnormalities in your ability to taste or smell?
 - 4. Did you have a fever of 37.5 degrees or higher in the past 2 weeks?
 - 5. Have you experienced any gastrointestinal symptoms such as diarrhea that lasted 4-5 days without any underlying known cause?
 - 6. Did you travel to other countries in the past 2 weeks? (Or have you been in close contact with anyone in your family or at your workplace who has travelled to other countries in the past 2 weeks?)
 - 7. In the past 2 weeks, have you been in close contact with a known or possible COVID-19 case (including someone whom you live with or at your workplace who suffering from a fever)?
- 8. Are you under quarantine (including self-quarantine) because of the possibility of close contact with a COVID-19 patient?

 Please note that even if you wish to receive the flu vaccine, it may not be possible due to your health status and/or availability of
- the vaccine.

 (4) Please remain 30 minutes after the vaccination on campus for observation, as there may be an acute adverse reaction.
- (5) Bring your student ID card, a ball pen, and cash on the day. Please pay us the correct price by cash. If you do not show your student's ID card, you cannot get the support.
- (6) Please have someone as a translator if you do not speak Japanese.
- (7) Please note that the number of vaccines might not be enough.
