HPV Vaccine Prevents Cervical Cancer

Women whose birthdays are between April 2, 1997 and April 1, 2009 and who have received at least one HPV vaccination by March 31, 2025 are eligible to receive the remaining vaccinations at public expense until March 31, 2026.

*Publicly funded vaccination for men is not available, but if you wish, you can be vaccinated at your own expense. Please inquire at a nearby medical institution.

HPV (human papillomavirus)

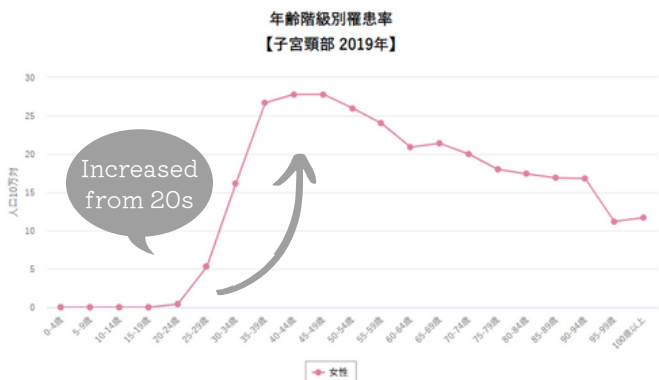
HPV is a common virus that most women are said to be infected with at least once in their lifetime. HPV can be transmitted by anyone who has had even one sexual contact.

It is involved in the development of many diseases, including cervical cancer, which is on the rise among young women, anal and oropharyngeal cancer, which can affect both men and women, and condyloma acuminatum.

The HPV vaccine can prevent some of these infections.

If you wish to be vaccinated, please contact the municipality in which you are registered as a resident.

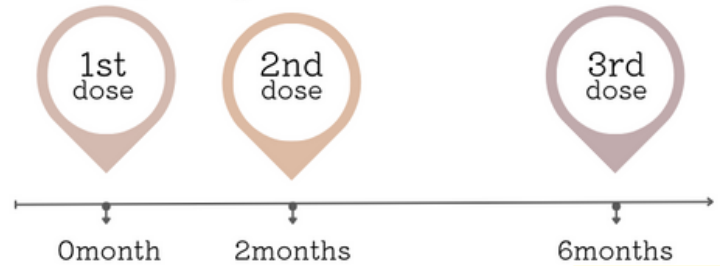
Cervical cancer incidence by age group in Japan
